Rajnath Singh approves Rs 400 crore Defence Testing Infrastructure Scheme



Union Defence minister **Rajnath Singh** has approved the launch of Defence Testing Infrastructure Scheme(**DTIS**) with a cost of Rs **400 crores** to create testing infrastructure for the defence sector so as to boost domestic defence and aerospace manufacturing.

Centre approves modified DPR of Ujh Multipurpose Project in Jammu and Kashmir



On 16th May 2020, The Centre approved to modification of the Detailed Project Report (**DPR**) of the Ujh multipurpose Project (**MPP**) located on the river Ujh,

main tributaries of river Ravi in Kathua district of Jammu and Kashmir at the estimated cost of Rs.9,167 crore.

Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan Part-3: Package for agriculture Fisheries and Food Processing Sectors detailed by Nirmala Sitharaman



The Part 3 of "Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan" (self-reliant India Movement) is consisted of **11 measures**. 8 measures are for improving agricultural infrastructure and 3 measures are for administrative and governance reforms, including removing restrictions on sale and stock limits of farm produce.

- NABARD anchored Rs 1 lakh crore Agri Infrastructure Fund for farmgate infrastructure for farmers
- Rs 10,000 crore scheme for Formalisation of Micro Food Enterprises (MFE)

- Amendments to Essential Commodities Act, 1955 to enable better price realisation for farmers



3rd advance estimates of production projects all time high foodgrain production of 295.67 million tonnes for 2019-20



According to Department of Agriculture, Cooperation and Farmers Welfare's 3rd Advance Estimates of production of major crops for **2019-20**, the total **foodgrain production** in the country is estimated to achieve a record of all-time high **295.67 million tonnes** in 2019-20 for the **4th consecutive year** since 2016-17 crop year (July-June).

e-NAM reaches 1000 mandis across 18 states and 3 Union Territories



On 15th May 2020, The Ministry of Agriculture announced that the e-NAM reached 1000 mandis across the nation in 18 states and 3 union

territories(**UTs**) with 38 new mandis integrated with the e-NAM platform of electronic agriculture trading portal.

i.Indian government has set a target of installing 75 gigawatts of renewable energy by the **FY 2021-22** and 275 gigawatts by **FY 2026-27** to transform the country's power sector from an expensive, unreliable, and polluting fossil fuel-based system into a low-cost, reliable and low-emission system based on renewable energy. ii.The **Bhadla Solar Park** in Rajasthan is the world's largest such installation to date, covering more than 14,000 acres with total capacity of 2,245 megawatts (MW)

GoM proposes land pooling to corporatise agri, merging MNREGA with skilling programmes



A Group of Ministers(**GoM**) panel headed by Social Justice and Empowerment Minister **Thawar Chand Gehlot** on employment and skill development has drafted a set of **proposals** that includes **land pooling** to corporatise agriculture, merging MNREGA with skilling programmes to create a wage subsidy programme.

Centre, WB govt inked loan agreements with AIIB and World Bank for \$413 mn Irrigation and Flood Management Project

Government of India and West Bengal Government have inked two loan agreements worth \$413.8 million for the "West Bengal Major Irrigation and Flood Management Project" to improve irrigation services and flood management in the Damodar Valley Command Area (DVCA) of West Bengal. World Bank has provided a loan of \$145million which has a6-year grace period, and a maturity of 23.5 years. Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) has provided a loan of \$145million which has a 6-year grace period, and a maturity of 24 years.

Rs 1,500 crores sanctioned for Punjab to ensure continuous credit flow to farmers: NABARD



The National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development(NABARD) has sanctioned Rs 1,500 crores for Punjab to ensure continuous credit flow to

farmers, through state cooperative banks, amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. Out of the total amount Rs 1,000 crores is sanctioned to Punjab State Cooperative Bank and Rs 500 crores to Punjab Gramin Bank.

Godrej consumer products arm picks balance 25% stake in Kenya's Canon Chemicals



Godrej East Africa Holdings Ltd, a subsidiary of FMCG (Fast-moving consumer goods) firm Godrej Consumer Products Ltd (GCPL), has acquired the balance 25% stake in Kenya-based Canon Chemicals Ltd for an undisclosed sum. Earlier on February 04, 2016, the Godrej group has acquired 75 % stake in Canon for an undisclosed sum.

Indian Navy commissions 7th ship of MK IV class Landing Craft Utility 'IN LCU L57' at Port Blair




Lt. General PS Rajeshwar, Commanding-in-Chief of Andaman & Nicobar Command, has commissioned the 103rd Landing Craft Utility (LCU) MK IV class vessel 'INLCU L 57' (Yard no: 2098) into the Indian Navy at Port Blair. It was the 7th in the series of 8 such vessels being indigenously made by Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers Limited (GRSE) for the Navy. The ship can be used for beaching operations, search and rescue, disaster relief operations, supply and replenishment and evacuation from distant islands.

CSIR collaborates with Intel India and IIIT-Hyderabad to develop solution and strategies to combat COVID-19



The Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) working with Intel India and International Institute of Information Technology(IIIT), Hyderabad in developing a faster and cost efficient COVID-19 diagnostic solution, an IT technology to understand epidemiology and AI based risk stratification for the patients.

Scientists of JNCASR Develops Injectable Silk Fibroin-based hydrogen for Insulin delivery in diabetic patients



The Research team of Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research (**JNCASR**) headed by Prof.T.Govindaraju developed the Silk Fibroin (**SF**) formulated using biocompatible additives and an injectable SF hydrogel (**iSFH**) to ease the insulin delivery for diabetic patients.

Bhopal's CSIR-AMPRI faculty Rajeev kumar develops lightweight carbon foam that can replace lead batteries

Dr. Rajeev Kumar of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research - Advanced Materials and Processes Research Institute (**CSIR -AMPRI**), who received the Inspire Faculty Award, has developed a porous lightweight **carbon foam** with a density of less than 0.3g/cc that can replace lead-grids in lead acid batteries.

COVID-19: University of Hyderabad, CSIR-CCMB ties up with Vins Bioproducts for antibody therapy



On May 15, 2020, University of Hyderabad (UoH) and CSIR (Council of Scientific and Industrial Research)-Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology (CCMB), have tied up with Vins Bioproducts Limited, an antisera manufacturing company incubated at UoH's BioNEST incubation centre, to develop **antibody-based immunotherapy** for immediate treatment for Covid-19 pandemic.

A novel tool to help gain deeper insights into Parkinson's disease



Scientists of Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) (Indian School of Mines ISM) Dhanbad and Council of Scientific and Industrial Research(CSIR)-Indian Institute of Chemical Biology(IICB) teamed up to find a solution to understand Parkinson's disease which is a common neurodegenerative disease with no cure.


